COACHES TIP FOR ELITE AND LEVEL SKATERS

Remember: You need to practice like you compete and compete like you practice. Hard work really does pay off.

RULES FOR SKATERS:

- ❖ Be on time and stay until the end of all sessions. You must give prior notification to your coach if you cannot be on time or have to leave early. If you must leave a session you must have permission of your coach.
- ❖ Continuous skating or movement. Skaters must be working with intensity on skating manoeuvres.
- ❖ Skaters are not to be working the music box.
- ❖ No talking! Skaters are to be skating not socializing.
- ❖ Do not interrupt the coaches. If skaters or parents interrupt another skater's lesson they will be charged a lesson for the time taken away from the skater. (Junior skaters can interrupt own coach for guidance, but please be respectful and brief.)
- ❖ If skaters cannot follow these rules they will be asked to leave the session.

Junior Skaters: As coaches we realize that junior skaters do not come to the ice already knowing what to practice during a session. It is a learning process and through our group classes and individual lessons the skater learns how to practice and get the most from a session. Remember, it does not happen overnight. We hope that our parents encourage and explain the rules as outlined above to the skater and try not to coach them from the stands. Skaters have to rely on their self and problem solve on their own when skating and competing. If you would like more guidance given to your skater, please set up more lessons with your private coach. All the rules are the same for all skaters and in this way fair play and consistency is maintained in our club. Our goal is to train great skaters as fast and fun as possible and we have proven methods of delivery. Thank you for your understanding.

- ❖ Please remember ice etiquette, your coach can guide you with this as there is an order that should be followed while skating.
- ❖ Lastly, the club is trying to maintain a status that you are all figure skaters and you represent the club. With this in mind, all skaters need to be **wearing proper figure skating clothes**. Lulu lemon, TNA, etc. and track pants are not acceptable. You need to have tight clothing around your ankles, so coaches can view your skates and assist you with your technique.
